Recipe of the Month Tacorito, submitted by SIR **Jim Brown** 

Meat: 2 pounds hamburger, 2 cloves garlic, 2 to 3 T chili powder, 1 can refried beans.

Brown hamburger and set aside. Warm beans and set aside.

Sauce: 2 cans cream of chicken soup, 1 can cheddar cheese soup, 2 cans water, 1 tsp ground cumin, 1 tsp oregano. Mix well and simmer for 30 minutes.


Fixin's: 1 package of 10 - 12 inch flour tortillas, lettuce, chopped tomato, chopped onion, chopped sharp cheddar cheese, grated. Picante hot sauce to taste. Quantities dependent on amount of tacoritos prepared.

To prepare: Place hamburger, beans and fixin's on flour tortillas. Cover with sauce. Fold and secure tacos with toothpicks. Place in pyrex dish (size as required). Pour sauce generously over finished tortillas and add hot sauce to taste. To stretch recipe, add ingredients as required.

Bake in 350 degree oven for 15 minutes or microwave on high for 2 minutes. Recipe may be stretched with the addition of more hamburger.






