The best thing on the menu was the good fellowship enjoyed by all. Next month, we assemble at the home of Sir **Dave Johnson**. Please call to confirm your presence.





Health Matters Physical and Mental

Wellness Made Easy

Don't throw away your Teflon and other nonstick pans

because of news that the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has asked manufacturers to gradually eliminate perfluorinated acid (PFOA), a chemical used in the production of nonstick coatings, as well as in many industrial and consumer products. At very high levels, PFOA causes cancer in lab animals, and recently an EPA advisory panel said it may be a human carcinogen, too. However, studies have found that virtually no PFOA remains in the cookware after manufacture. The EPA does not advise people to stop using these products. Still, don't overheat nonstick cookware. As the instructions state, it is not designed for high-heat cooking. The coating begins to break down at 535 degrees F (frying is typically 400 to 470 degrees), at which point fumes may be released. No one knows if the fumes pose any long-term risk to humans, but such temperatures can easily start a fire.

If you are over 70, you should pay special attention to your HDL ("good") cholesterol level. In that age group, low HDL (below 45 mg/dl) may be an even stronger indicator of cardiovascular risk than high LDL ("bad") cholesterol, according to a large recent study in Circulation.

To reduce the risk of age-related macular degeneration (AMD), eat foods rich in vitamin E and C, beta carotene and zinc, suggests a recent study in the Journal of the American Medical Association. People who consumed the most of these nutrients were 35% less likely to develop AMD (a leading cause of blindness) over an eight-year period than those who consumed less-than-average amounts. Some subjects also got these nutrients from dietary supplements, but the study concluded that foods rich in these nutrients seem to be more important. Foods rich in E include nuts, seeds, vegetable oils, broccoli, and whole grains. Zinc is found in meat, fish, dairy products, and whole grains. Carrots, spinach, and cantaloupe are good sources of beta carotene. Citrus fruit, peppers, broccoli, and potatoes are among the best sources of C.

Drink plenty of fluids when exercising or working outdoors in cold weather. It's easy to become dehydrated in cold weather because of the water you lose from breathing, sweating, and stepped-up urine production. In addition, the cold actually impairs the thirst mechanism, so people tend to drink less, according to recent research from the University of New Hampshire.




