
We played three tables of bridge on March 31st at the home of **Fred Bolton**. First place went to **Rich Ahlf** with 5520 points.



## **Fishing Report**

Paul Dubow We have had a very successful month. It began with our monthly meeting where we conducted our annual silent auction and many of our anglers were able to purchase lots of gear at a reduced price.



Sturgeon fishing remained strong. **Gordon Linebaugh, Terry Miller,** and **Carl Moyer** caught several keepers on one trip, but released them in the hopes of tagging larger ones, given that the day limit is one fish and the annual limit is four fish. **Tom Boltz** of Branch 146 caught a 60 lb sturgeon fishing on **Rich Fiscina's** boat on April 15. **Rich** wanted to be sure that this event made this month's SIR Call article and so he immediately called in from the boat. However, he had to interrupt the call when a 54 pounder struck his line. **Rich** landed the fish and then released it.

Striper fishing also picked up. **Mike Corker** landed a keeper striper while fishing for sturgeon with **Carl Moyer. Tom Kostik**, who fishes only for stripers and is quite expert at it, took **Terry Miller** out on his boat in a rainstorm. They ignored the rain and landed 38 fish, with 10 keepers up to 10 lbs. All but two were released. **Joe Karg** went fishing for sturgeon on a party boat. He did not catch any sturgeon but he did land a striper and came home with some sturgeon meat given to him by a kindly stranger. **Joe Miscione, Mario Moratorio,** and **Karl Droese** landed a bunch of stripers in Montezuma Slough as well as a near keeper sturgeon.

Trout fishing was also active. **Chuck Vanoncini** and his son fly fished at Henderson Springs Resort and caught and released over 50 trout weighing from four to seven pounds. Fishing at San Pablo Reservoir, **Terry Miller** caught a nice limit. His companion, **Harry Sherinian**, did not catch a limit but did land three fish between five and eight pounds. On other trips to San Pablo, **Mike Corker** caught a four pounder while **George Vogt**, **Gordon Linebaugh**, **George Schultz**, **Carl Moyer**, **Ron Maciak**, and **Barry Rauchle** caught near limits. However, **Paul Dubow** and **Carl Moyer** came home empty handed fishing from shore at Shadow Cliffs Reservoir.

The salmon season began on April 5 and **Carl Moyer** commenced it on a high note, catching a 10 pounder fishing out of Moss Landing.

Finally, **Gene Schulting** of Branch 146 and his son caught a mess of catfish on the Delta.

We will be very busy this spring with Delta fishing for sturgeon, stripers, and catfish; trout in mountain and local lakes; and salmon from the ocean. Our next meeting will be on Thursday, May 22, at the Legends Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course, 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. 
## **Duplicate** Bridge


