# New Member Relations Committee Report to the BEC, 9-11-08

The New Member Relations Committee (NMRC) was established to serve as a resource to new members and, indeed, maintains personal contact through the early months of membership. The purpose is to gage the level of comfort the new member feels with the organization and to address issues noted.

To this end, meetings have been held with those men who were inducted in 2007, consisting of two groups of 14 and 16, respectively. In addition, phone interviews have been conducted with most of the men inducted in the first quarter of 2008.

We have received a lot of input from these new members and they overwhelmingly feel positive about the Branch, its management and their experiences so far. They like the idea of the NMRC being proactive, reaching out to members. Here are few examples of suggestions which have come out of this program:

- Several participants liked the idea of "mixers" such as the random seating days. Consensus was for increasing from one to two per year. *The October meeting will be a random seating day, our second for 2008.*
- One man suggested that we set up tables designated for new members and guests at the luncheons. *This has been implemented successfully*.
- It was noted that older members do not often make an effort to meet/greet new members and suggested that new members wear a different color nametag and that older members be encouraged to interface with newer men. *New members will henceforth wear yellow badges for their first six months.*
- One suggestion was that the luncheon programs be assigned to a Program Committee, perhaps headed by the Little Sir. *This and other input lead to approval by the BEC and is being implemented*. There were several more suggestions aimed at helping new members become acquainted with each other and older members which are still being discussed. Among them are:

-Schedule more day trips and outings. Couples Dine Out group now in the formation stage, be chaired by **Don Tubb**, might be one solution to this issue.

-Having Activity Chairs clearly advertise that "new members are welcome" and/or "skill is not a prerequisite" for most of these activities.

-Assign tasks to groups of new members to encourage them to work as a team to accomplish the task. This was suggested by a Shriner. In his experience, long term bonds were formed between the men.

This new focus on the needs of new members has spawned some good ideas. It has also provided us the opportunity to measure the satisfaction level of this group and how welcome they feel. My conclusion is that they are generally enthusiastic about SIR and Branch 146.




