

The best ocean salmon season in years is winding down as the silvers head up the rivers of their birth to spawn and produce the salmon that will be biting in 2020. The larger fish have been caught

north of the Gate with boats from Half Moon Bay producing slightly smaller fish.

Brion Beetz, who joined Branch 146 this year, was among those who brought some large salmon home for the table. He also caught some leopard sharks on an outing in San Francisco Bay. 
