

Recipe of the month Submitted by **Sir David Johnson** 

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

½ pkg. Oscar Meyer Center Cut Bacon (12 oz.)

1 large onion, thinly sliced

3/4 cup dark brown sugar

½ teaspoon garlic powder

½ cup apple cider vinegar

Drain and rinse 1 - 16 oz. can each of:

butter beans green beans

green lima beans

dark red kidney beans

2 – 28 oz. cans <u>B and M Original Baked Beans</u>

#### DIRECTIONS:

Fry bacon until crisp, blotting excess fat with paper towel.

In large oven-proof pot (5qt. casserole) combine onion, brown sugar, vinegar and garlic powder.

Stir well and cook on top of stove for 2-3 minutes (until onions are slightly soft).

Add beans and crisp bacon, reserving a few strips for the top.

Mix everything together.

Lay reserved bacon strips on top of mixture. Cook uncovered @ 350 degrees for at least an hour.

At lunch time, sit in your parked car with sunglasses on and point a hair dryer at passing cars. See if they slow down.

# Health Matters Physical and Mental

#### MIRACLE PILL

The chemical name is acetylsalicylic acid. The generic name is aspirin. Indeed, it is today's miracle drug. Here's why:

#### Lower blood pressure

A recent Spanish study found that taking 100 mg of aspirin a day can lower systolic (the top number) pressure by an average of 7 points and diastolic (the lower number) by an average of 6 points. P.S. It only worked when taken before bed.

#### Stop the itch

Gotten into poison ivy, sumac, oak? Crush a few aspirin tablets, mix into some hand lotion, and apply, per **Vail Reese**, MD, a dermatologist with the Dermatology Medical Group of San Francisco.

#### Lower risk of prostate cancer

Men who take nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs like aspirin daily have half the risk of developing prostate cancer, says **Rosebud Roberts**, MD, of the Mayo Clinic.

#### Relieve sunburn

If you take a couple of 325 mg aspirin tablets an hour or two after getting too much sun, you will end up with a lot less blistering according to **Dr. Reese**.

#### Prevent a heart attack

If you have even one risk factor for heart disease, the US Preventive Health Task Force recommends taking one 81 mg tablet a day.

#### Erase calluses

Mix 5 or 6 aspirin tablets with a half teaspoon each of lemon juice and water. Coat your calluses and cover with a warm washcloth for 10 minutes. Acids in the aspirin will soften the callus so that it will come right off with a few strokes of a pumice stone, according to **Suzanne Levine**, PhD, podiatrist at New York Presbyterian Hospital.

#### Avoid colon cancer

Taking an 81 mg dose of aspirin a day can reduce colon cancer risk by 50%. "Aspirin inhibits the growth of polyps, which are known precursors to colon cancer," says **John Baron**, MD, researcher with Dartmouth University.

#### Get rid of cold sores

Semmelweis Medical University of Hungary found that taking a 125 mg aspirin tablet daily at the onset of a cold sore can cut the duration of infection in half, says chief

I was born on April 10, 1923 in Crockett, CA. I went to schools in the Martinez area and graduated from Alhambra High in June, 1942. I enlisted in the United States

I then went back to school to finish my senior year. In March I went to work for Union Oil Company in Rodeo, California as a guard on the night shift, which allowed me to attend school during the day. I graduated in June of '42 and was called to active duty on July 19, 1942. First posting was to Government Island at Alameda for my basic training. In October, upon completion of boot camp, I was sent to N.Y. City College for training on the operation and repair of all types of gas, diesel and steam engines. When I completed that course in September of 1943, I returned to the US Coast Guard base in San Francisco. Next was my transfer to the U.S.S. Leonard Wood, APA12, in October. This ship was involved in seven assault landings in the Pacific. The personnel on this ship were very lucky to survive all of these landings with very few casualties. I stayed on board the Leonard Wood until she was taken out of service in March, 1946. I was then honorably discharged as an M.M.2c and went back to work for the Union Oil Company in Rodeo. Then I met my lovely wife-to-be, **Bonnie**, in 1948. We were married in Carson City, Nevada, October 28, 1949. We had three children, 2 boys and 1 girl. We are now the proud grandparents of 4 grandchildren and have 1 great grandchild.

We have lived in the same house now for 50 plus years in Concord, California and have done a lot of remodeling to it. We still like the area very much. I retired from Union Oil Company in June of '86 with over 44 years of service, 35 of those years as a process foreman. My life has been filled with many good times. I've hunted all types of birds and animals such as deer, bear and elk. I fished for shell fish in the bays, lakes, streams and ocean for many years in California, Mexico and Washington. I've been an old 49er faithful for 40 plus years. I've been playing golf for 40 plus years and still play 2 to 3 rounds each and every week—weather permitting.

#### Reduce risk of Alzheimer's disease

Researchers at Erasmus Medical Center in the Netherlands found that people who used aspirin regularly for several years had a nearly 80 percent lower risk of developing Alzheimer's, say **Peter Zandi**, PhD, a researcher at Johns Hopkins University Medical Center.

#### Make babies

Infertile women given a daily dose of fertility drugs combined with 100 mg of aspirin were 40 percent more likely to become pregnant than those just taking drugs.

#### Protect against strokes

Strokes are caused by blood clots. Aspirin use reduces the potential of blood clotting. "It's one of the best means I've found for preventing strokes," says **Dr. Baron.**
