Checks are payable to "SIR 146."</u> The final play written by famous prize-winning playwright Eugene O'Neill will be performed in the Old Barn at Tao House in the Danville hills. The production is part of the 13th annual Eugene O'Neill Festival, and also celebrates the 75th anniversary of Tao House at the Eugene O'Neill National Historic Site.

A Moon for the Misbegotten, written while O'Neill and his wife lived in Danville 1937 – 1944 is a rustic comedy/drama of love and anguish, and seen by many as one of O'Neill's finest works. "Everything about it is so tremendous that it reduces almost every other modern play to virtual pettiness," according to NY Post critic **Richard Watts** when the play premiered in New York in 1957.

This production of **A Moon for the Misbegotten** is a notable event for drama-lovers, who will want to see this important play presented in the location where it was originally written. O'Neill is the only American playwright to be awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature.

Like many of O'Neill's plays, the story of **A Moon for the Misbegotten** has connections to O'Neill's own life and family. This play pays tribute to his brother, **Jamie**, and it vibrates with love, moonlight and truth.

Transportation to Tao House and the Eugene O'Neill National Historic Site is by National Park Service shuttle only. Private vehicles are not permitted.

Instructions for shuttle pick-up at Danville's Museum of the San Ramon Valley on Railroad Avenue will be provided in advance to ticket holders. The performance begins at 8:00 p.m., with shuttle times beginning about 6:30 p.m. so time is available to visit the historic home and grounds.



We welcome new attendees. If you have a Mac question or would like to be on our email listing, please contact one our leaders. We are here to help you.




