In future meetings, the BEC will discuss whether, and for how long, we should temporarily relocate to the Concord Hilton and would like your input. Please share your opinion with any BEC member.

Little Sir's Corner

Have you ever looked up in the night sky and wondered about the origins of the Universe? Then come to our September luncheon and listen to Professor Ron Olowin of St. Mary's College. His topic is "The State of the Cosmos," a

multimedia representation of our sense-of-place.

Professor Ron Olowin arrived at St. Mary's College after completing his doctorate at the University of Oklahoma. Before teaching he was a research astronomer at the Royal Observatory in South Africa and director of Oklahoma's Kirkpatrick Planetarium.

While his astronomy work relies on cutting-edge technology and computers, he is well-schooled in the role that the stars have played in ancient cultures.

The most enduring legacy of Professor Olowin's presence at St. Mary's is the College's observatory. In 1997 he applied for grants and persuaded Louis Geissberger, a former science alumnus, to provide financial support for its construction.

Since then he has inspired his students – not just in astronomy, but in other subjects as well. In 2007-08 he was named Professor of the Year. Professor Olowin and his wife, Mary, live in Lafayette and have three grown children.

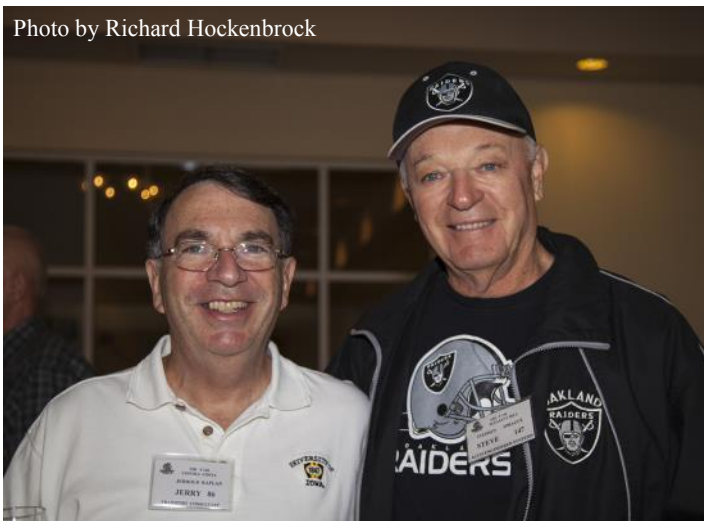

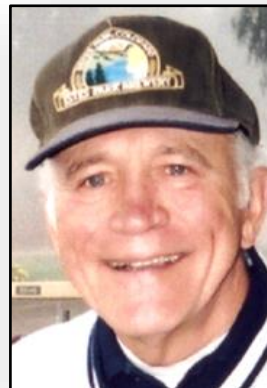

Turn right and follow Giant Highway as it jogs left, crosses railroad tracks, and jogs right for a total of 0.7 miles to the park entrance, left. Go 0.1 mile to the entrance kiosk, then turn left into the parking area. The trailhead is at the northwest corner of the parking area.

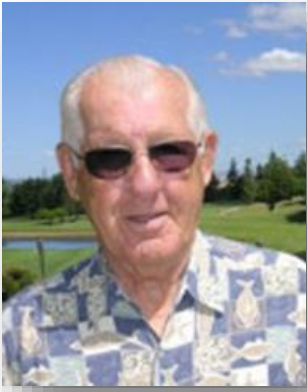

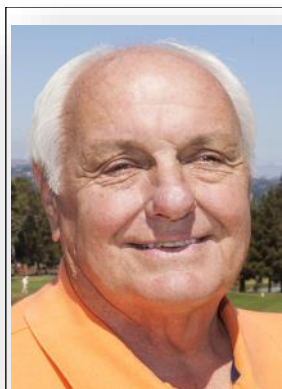
Luncheon Attendance

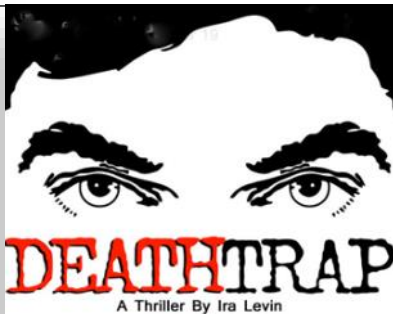

SIR 146 Theatre Party
Wednesday, November 19th

One of Broadway's all-time favorite thrillers is on tap for the SIR 146 Theatre Party on Wednesday, November 19th. Ira Levin's famous who-dun-it, DEATHTRAP, will be staged at the Leshner Center in Walnut Creek by Center REPeritory Company.

Since it premiered over thirty-five years ago, DEATHTRAP has been a favorite for theatre-goers. Even if you've seen it before, this play excites the audience with all the plot twists and turns that make for a very entertaining evening in the theatre.

A limited number of reserved tickets has been set aside for SIR members and guests for the 7:30 p.m. performance on November 19. Deadline for reservations is October 30, or until all our allocation has been reached.

DEATHTRAP received rave reviews from the New York Times critic when it opened in 1978. Critic Walter Kerr wrote that this play contained "effrontery everywhere and fun straight through." Another critic allowed that this play "proves that murder can be fun." It was nominated for Broadway's Tony Award as Best Play, and holds the record as the longest running comedy-thriller in Broadway history.

In the play, playwright Sidney Bruhl has had several successful plays, along with a few recent flops. To help get his creative juices going, he invites one of his students, who has just completed a mystery play, over to offer suggestions. This leads to questions of Bruhl's intent to steal the student's manuscript -- or was he just kidding?

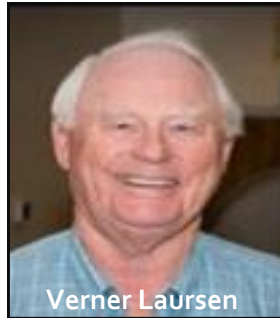

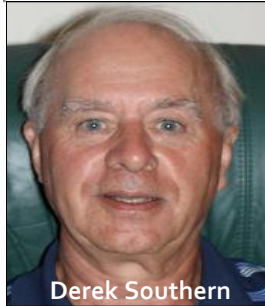

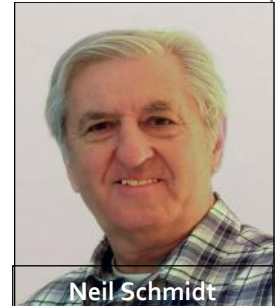
