





Last Month's Attendance:

There were 226 meals served at our August luncheon. I'm told this may be an all-time record. Nearly 77% of our membership was in attendance. I believe that is a

near record. We had only 13 unexcused absentees ("no shows"), that is only 4.5% of our membership. Traditionally, we expect about 10% of the membership will be no shows. We use that 10% figure in calculating the number of meals for which we guarantee payment. Because of these two factors, we went five meals over the number of meals for which the kitchen was obligated. We are, however, blessed with a kitchen staff at Boundary that is able to meet such exigencies with surprising alacrity. I am most thankful for that. My apologies to the last four arriving members who had to wait a bit while the wait staff set a table for you. I appreciate your patience and genial understanding.

September Luncheon: Our September luncheon will be held on Thursday, the 10th, at the Boundary Oak Golf Course in Walnut Creek. Remember, we assume you are coming unless you notify us timely that you are not. Accordingly, if you are unable to attend, please send an email message to "nolunchbranch146@gmail.com" by NOON FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 4th (the "no show deadline"). Please also provide your badge number in that message. If you do not have convenient access to a computer please call 925-979-5146 before the no show deadline and follow the prompts given there. The Friday noon deadline is required in order for us to meet our deadline to give Boundary our guaranteed number of meals. A non-attending member who fails to meet this deadline without good cause is required by our rules to reimburse the Branch \$25 for the liability we will incur for his meal.

Confirmation of "No Show" Notices: I intend to confirm via reply email or phone call to each "no show" notifier the receipt of his notice. *If you have not received such confirmation within a day or two after communicating your notice please call me at 925-408-6004.* This is important because there have been times when emails, for a variety of reasons, were not displayed in the "no lunch" mailbox.


Payment: Remember that the luncheon will be called to order at 11:45 am. Please allow enough time to check in

SIR 146 Hiking Rich Ahlf

On September 11th, we will be hiking the French Trail loop at Redwood Regional Park. This is a 6 mile **moderate** loop hike that hits all the highlights of this well-shaded park nestled in the Oakland hills. This is a peaceful, hidden bowl of coastal redwoods with a creek at the bottom. Notice

this hike is rated as moderate, I am allotting four hours with plenty of breaks and a lunch stop. Hiking poles are recommended as the first section is a steep uphill, after that will be a mostly level hike through the redwoods.

Directions: Take Highway 13 to Redwood Road, turn left and drive about 3 miles to the Redwood Gate and park in the first lot on the left after the Fishway interpretive site. Redwood Regional Park, 7867 Redwood Road.

If you wish to carpool, meet at the turnoff at St Stevens Rd off Highway 24 at 9:30 am, turn right and park on El Nino Rd where there is plenty of parking.



points; and in third place were **Lynn** and **Dasha Freeman** with 21 points. **Margot Somerville** will host the next couples duplicate bridge on September 16th.






Nine Hole Golf Group Verner Laursen
