

New Hike - Great Views

On Friday, September 8th, we will be hiking in Tilden Regional Park, I did this hike last week and I'd say it has the best views of any hike we have done so far. From the ridge we have views of Briones and

San Pablo reservoirs and the San Francisco Bay all the way out to the Golden Gate Bridge. This hike will be around 5 mi with some uphill at the beginning. Total ascent is 785 ft. We will start on the Vollmer Peak Trail up to the Seaview Trail along the ridge to the Lower Springs Trail and back down the Quarry Trail. I did not do the Quarry Trail last week, however this looks like an easier downhill. The Vollmer Trail is well maintained and steep in a few places. Dogs are allowed on this hike.

Take Hwy 24 to Fish Ranch Rd, right onto Grizzly Peak Blvd and right onto South Park Drive. We'll meet at the Big Springs parking area.

If you wish to carpool, meet at the turnoff at St. Stephen's Drive off Hwy 24 at 9:30 am. Turn right and park on El Nino Rd where there is plenty of parking. I have room for two.

Pickleball



Just when we thought we had exhausted dining at all the area restaurants, we were able to find a new one for September! We will be going to MoMo's in Walnut Creek – located on California Blvd, the site

where McCovey's used to be. We had dinner there a few weeks ago and were impressed with the entrees. For our Dining Out event we were able to get a good price for an excellent menu, which includes a choice of a wedge salad or clam chowder soup (both excellent!) and a choice of four entrees. The choices are a yummy gumbo – chock full of sausage, chicken, and prawns in a mild spicy sauce; a chicken pot pie; seared beef tenderloin medallions; and a pan seared salmon. Dessert is a raspberry sorbet. Coffee and sodas are included. The total cost is just \$40, inclusive of tax and tip. As of this writing we have 56 diners signed up so we have room for just two more couples - let me know asap if you are interested in joining us. The restaurant has a great happy hour with house wine and beer for just \$5 before 6 pm. For those with adventurous tastes, there are \$1 oysters available before 6 pm as well as some other appetizers.

We will take over most of the restaurant and will have plenty of room. Metered street parking is available or the Lesher public parking garage is just a block away.

We are considering having a "fancy" dinner again in November – and returning to Vic Stewart's in Walnut Creek for an end of year celebration of our good fortunes. You will recall we went there last year for a menu of some wonderful steak entrees. The cost last year was \$70 per person but we sold out with about 45 diners – and we have not yet approached the restaurant for a final price and menu. Please let me know at the Momo's dinner, SIR luncheon or by email if you would like to do this again. We had a great time last year!



included Sir Jeff Baily and wife Alicia.




