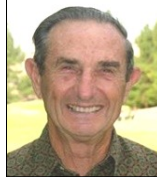


Poker Club #1 Frank McNamee

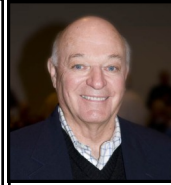

Then he hooked a keeper of around 55 inches. Just yards from the boat, the sturgeon leaped high in the air, smiled broadly, and broke the line. But it was a great experience. **Terry Miller**, his son **Steve**, **George Schulze**, **Ron Yates**, **Dick Thomson**, **Carl Moyer**, and **Harry Sherinian** all joined in the fun that day. **Terry Miller** and **Carl Moyer** fished the same spot twice more, catching more small sturgeon and **Terry's** first keeper of the year, a 51 inch beauty. **Terry** said it grew to 53 inches by the time he got it home. The only sturgeon fisherman who was skunked this month was yours truly. **Carl** and I fished in Benicia and went home without a bite. This was the second time that this has happened this year. Was it something that I said? Moving over to the trout fishing at Shadow Cliffs Reservoir, **Dick Thomson** and his son **Lee** caught a limit of five each with fish up to four pounds. **Carl Moyer** also picked up a limit that day while **Joe Miscione** and a friend caught a total of four, with largest weighing three pounds. **Joe** and his son **Keith** drove up to Bass Lake in the Sierra and caught and released over forty rainbows. A group trip planned for the end of the month was cancelled when we learned that the lake will be drained in order to repair the dam. **Joe Peterson** got an early start on striped bass fishing when he trolled up two nice ones to 28 inches. That is rare for this early in the season and could be a very good omen. The striper fishing has been poor for the past few seasons. **Jerry Smith** and his son made a second trip to the upper Sacramento, fly fishing for trout and improved over last month's outing by bagging a 24 inch steelhead and three rainbows.

We will be very busy this spring with delta fishing for bass, catfish, stripers and sturgeon, trout fishing in local lakes, party boat trips for sturgeon and halibut and what looks like a promising salmon season. Once again, we invite those who put their rods away a long time ago or have never tried angling to join us. We always can lend you equipment. Our next meeting will be Thursday, April 28, at the Legends Sport Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. 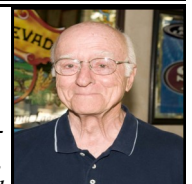

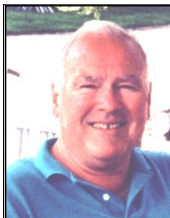
