No formal fishing trips are planned for the next few months but good size fish are being caught in some of the local reservoirs and they are easily planned with only a few phone calls. Several members have stated an interest in attending the San Mateo International Sportsman's Exposition in early February and the same show in Pleasanton in the middle of March.
