



That inspired **Paul Dubow** to try it, but he came away with just one small trout. As they say, he should have been there yesterday.

Paul did much better on his 40th annual trip to the north woods of Wisconsin to fish with his old buddies from Milwaukee, catching and releasing large amounts of walleye pike and smallmouth bass. He also caught a horse and a cat, that is, a red horse sucker and a channel catfish.

We were reminded that accessing the emergency response system by calling 911 on a cell phone may result in a major delay while the call is re-routed to the correct agency.
