I look forward to seeing everyone at the meeting on the 9th.




Membership Ron Lew



We are back in business, but things are not quite normal yet. We have received permission from state SIR to resume activities. We will follow the restrictions imposed by the

jurisdictions in which we fish and meet. Consequently, we will not resume our monthly breakfast meetings for a while. Instead, we will continue to meet on Zoom. Our next meeting is at 8:30 am on July 24. If you wish to join us, please send an email to Big Fish **Ron Lew** and he will supply you with a sign-in link. Permission to resume activities has meant resuming fishing, but again with the COVID 19 restrictions. Some of us have fished on party boats with half loads and increased prices. Some freshwater lakes have opened up with restrictions and most launch ramps for bay and ocean fishing have opened. Bob Stein, Brion Beetz, Raleigh Davis, Stan Wong, and Carl Moyer caught quite a few halibut fishing on the Huck Finn just outside of the Golden Gate. Stan also caught a beautiful limit of two salmon while fishing much further out in the ocean. After he cleaned the fish, he still had 41 lbs. of delicious eating. Duane Einhorn, a new member of both the fishing group and Branch 146, also caught limits of salmon and halibut fishing on the ocean. Chuck Vanoncini resumed his regular trips to Lake Almanor where he and his friends caught guite a few rainbow trout. Brion Beetz joined Carl Moyer on his boat and they landed rockfish, cabezon, and ling cod on the ocean. Ernie Wong had an awesome time fishing for shad on the Yuba River, where he caught and released 125 on a single day's outing. Tom Kostik once again set out to do regular semiweekly black bass and striper fishing in the Delta, but on one adventure, he landed a halibut and some rockfish. Gordon Linebaugh and his grandchildren fished Round Valley Lake near Greenville, where they caught and devoured about fifteen bluegills.





In addition to the many Branch activities, the Luncheon provides a great opportunity to reconnect with friends and meet new people with whom you may already have something in common.


We don't know when the Luncheons will resume or under what rules and restrictions but, sometime after the shelter in place order is lifted.

SIR 146 Hiking Mark Curtis

We will be walking/hiking at East Bay Regional Park at Point Pinole on Friday, July 10th, starting at 10 am. This is a loop hike of about 4.5 miles

and minimal elevation gain. If the day is warm elsewhere, you will find this walk to be very pleasant as it is very close to the bay and marshlands, even with the normal 5 to 10 mph breeze. If 4.5 miles is too much for some, it's very easy to shorten the loop for a return to the parking lot. There should be a few opportunities to observe water fowl near the pier or on the bay side of the point. And we may walk about 1,000 feet to the end of this fishing pier. Most of this walk is shaded via fairly mature eucalyptus trees.


On a historical note, this property was formerly used to make dynamite by Giant Chemical in the 1850's and then later by Atlas Chemical until the early 1900's. There is 1 piece of equipment on the Marsh trail donated by Hercules Chemical that formerly was used to manufacture dynamite.

Yes, I realize that some or most of you still have concerns regarding exposure to COVID. But walking out doors is, in my opinion, much safer than going to the grocery or drug store. During the walk/hike we will be maintaining the recommended minimum 6 foot spacing. And if we cannot do that, please bring a face covering to actually wear in the event that appropriate spacing isn't possible. All restrooms have been open for the last month or so, and I don't expect that to change. However, the water fountains are still turned off, so bring an appropriate amount of water, and maybe snacks, for your own needs.

We will meet in the Giant parking lot which is accessible via Atlas Road. From I-80 westbound, take Richmond Parkway toward Richmond bridge, after about 3 miles, take a right on Atlas Road. At the 4 way stop intersection take a left and go about 1+ miles to the Giant parking lot. Please plan on arriving at the Giant lot between 9:45 and 10:00 am.

I look forward to seeing at least a few of you. My wife will most likely also participate so I know there will be two!!



Book Group John Pearl

Six members of the SIR 146 Book Group convened via Zoom on Monday morning, June 15th. Thanks to **Mike Farrar** who shared his wife's Zoom application that does not have the 40-minute time

limit.

We discussed one of John Steinbeck's major works, *East of Eden*, which describes the path that two families, the Hamilton's and the Trask's, took to the Salinas Valley and their lives both before their arrival and after, and all their interactions. The author's descriptions of the scene were very complete and, in some ways, magnificent. The valley itself was described beautifully, both the geography and the geology, as well as its history. We also learned that it extends a significant distance to the south of Salinas.

The families included immigrants from Ireland and a farming family from Connecticut. The author's descriptions of his characters were absolutely amazing, both in the physical and mental aspects. There were connections to the Bible, with a "Cain and Abel" situation between two half-brothers that did not end well. The author, born and raised in Salinas, appears as a minor character in one of the main families. An important character turns out to be a person of Chinese descent who is a long-time servant of one the families and serves as the glue helping to raise the two brothers and hold the family together. He is a bit of a philosopher and an educated person.

An important character is the wife of the leader of one of the main families, who turns out to be an evil person. She leaves after giving birth to twins to become a fallen woman. Her boys are twins, but not identical, and the boys are quite different, and are also a bit of a "Cain and Abel" pair.

All these characters are extraordinarily complex, and the author weaves them in and out of the story, showing his amazing writing abilities. There are lots of surprises and unexpected endings, but a feeling of completeness when the reader finishes.

There is a movie built around the second half of the book, but it certainly is not true to it. One gets the general scenes and plots presented in the book, but not the details put down by the by the author. It does show what happens to the Trask family during this period.






