
Big Sir's Commentary:



WORSE TIME TO TAKE CALCIUM

Taking supplemental calcium at breakfast may be a waste. Often cereal and orange juice are calcium fortified and since milk contains calcium as does your multivitamin, you may be ingesting as much as your body can absorb at one time (about 500 mg). Nutritionists suggest taking your calcium supplement with a meal where there is less calcium from other sources.

NONDRUG HELP FOR HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE

Lifestyle changes may reduce or eliminate your need for hypertensive medication. May Clinic doctors recommend the following:

- Maintain a healthy weight.** Even a reduction of 10 pounds can help.
- Exercise.** Thirty to forty minutes a day is recommended.
- Eat well.** Choose low-fat dairy products, whole grains, and fruits and vegetables to maintain an adequate potassium intake.
- Reduce sodium.** Limit sodium to 2,000 to 3,000 milligrams a day.
- Stop smoking.** Nicotine raises blood pressure.
- Limit alcohol.** Men should consume no more than one ounce of alcohol (2 ounces of 100-proof liquor, 24 ounces of beer, or 10 ounces of wine) a day.
- Limit caffeine.** Caffeine can cause a rise in blood pressure in some people.
- Manage stress.** Find ways to relax.

John Demos



Born November 18, 1922 in Elkhart, Indiana, a town of about 35,000, located 5 miles from the Michigan border, 100 miles east of Chicago. We were Cub fans. My parents who were both Greek immigrants, ended up in Elkhart because it was potentially a little boomtown. It never boomed but it was a good town for a kid to grow up in. At that time, Elkhart produced more band instruments

than any city in the world and Alka Seltzer was also produced there.

I attended Indiana University at Bloomington long before Bobby Knight got there. College was interrupted by WW II and I served 2 1/2 years in the Army Air Corp as a radio operator-gunner on a B-24 crew and completed 23 missions with the 15th air force in Italy when Germany surrendered. I was home on my 30 day leave when they dropped the atomic bomb and it was all over.

I went back to I.U. and graduated. Started and quit several jobs and learned how to play golf in and around Indiana. Came to Oakland in 1956 and soon got in the investment business ending up with what is now Morgan Stanley, a total of 40 years.

In 1964 I met a pretty little girl from Mississippi (much younger than I) and she changed my life. We moved to Moraga and have two sons who went through the entire Moraga school systems, both married and one grandson and it looks like another is on the way.

When I was close to retiring, my friend Russ Bliese urged me to join SIR146 but I wasn't sure I wanted to associate and play golf with a bunch of old guys. But I did and never met a better group and I'm glad I did.

Recipe of the Month

Oriental Chicken Salad

4 c Chicken, cooked, skinned, boned and cut into bit sized pieces. Refrigerate.
 2 pkgs Ramen Noodles, crushed and toasted in the oven for 15-20 minutes at 350 degrees.
 1/2 c sliced almonds 1/2 c sunflower seeks
 Toast almonds and sunflower seeds about 10 minutes at 350 degrees (they burn easily).
 1-1/2 lb Napa cabbage, coarsely chopped.
 8 green onions, including tops, chopped.
 Combine above ingredients and toss lightly.
 Dressing: (add a few hours prior to serving).
 3/4 c salad oil 1/2 Tbsp sugar
 1/2 c Tarragon or red wine vinegar. 6 Tbsp soy sauce
 1/2 tsp freshly groundpepper.
 Mix with salad ingredients and serve as above.


